



New Bank at Proston



(The Leader newspaper 29th March 1967)

The new Commercial Bank at Proston which will be officially opened by the works & Housing Minister, (Mr J Bjelke-Petersen) next Tuesday morning. The attractive looking building and its furnishings cost in the vicinity of \$28,000. The bank's State Manager, Mr William Love, will attend the opening. The "Commercial" started business in the Proston district at Hivesville in September 1922 before moving to Proston in July 1928. The first manager was Mr Frank Doherty. The present manager is Mr L Pilgrim.

Those were the days



The Commercial Bank later became the Westpac Bank and when the Proston branch was closed in 1993, the property was purchased by the Wondai Shire Council. It was then transformed into a Library at a total cost of \$40,000. The new Library was opened on the 1st June 1994.
