

## **Lookout for Proston!**







One of the pleasures of driving into Proston is coming over the hill and looking out over a panorama of beautiful farmland to the hills in the distance. If you happen to catch one of our amazing sunsets it's even more breathtaking.

The Proston & District Heritage Association are working with the South Burnett Regional Council to establish a Lookout on the Proston Abbeywood Road, just a short distance from the main Wondai Proston Road. The Council have slashed the area and are preparing a plan to enable easy



access for cars and caravans. The Heritage Association is seeking funding for signage which will depict the geological structure and history of the area as well as a brief history of early settlement.

It is also hoped to add a covered picnic table. This should be a popular spot with tourists, locals and keen photographers and a welcome addition to our area.
