# Labyrinth Celebration

A special gathering, attended by about 50 people, was held on Saturday 15th February to mark the completion of the Proston Community Labyrinth.

The labyrinth, which was the vision of our Community Health Nurse, Kathy Crane, became a reality through the provision of a South Burnett Regional Council Community grant. The grant was auspiced by the Proston Lions Club.

Kathy expressed her thanks to Heath Sander from Sander's Bobcat Hire for preparing the site and Terry Mayne from Murgon Rotary for his donation of the pavers.

A small group of volunteers, under the expert guidance of 2020 South Burnett Volunteer of the Year John Power, spent many hours working to lay the pavers in the correct formation.





The result is a pathway wide enough to accommodate wheelie walkers, wheelchairs and prams, making the labyrinth accessible to all.

Speakers at the event were Mayor Keith Campbell, Deputy Mayor Kathy Duff, Lions Club representative Jan Barsby, Catholic Parish priest Fr Bryan Pipin and Community Nurse Kathy Crane.

All were invited to walk the labyrinth and place a candle in the

centre. The morning concluded with a cuppa under the trees.

The labyrinth is open to everyone and is the perfect place to take some time out for peaceful reflection and relaxation. Perhaps this might be a good option for some gentle exercise during this time of self isolation . A timber bench seat under the shade of the trees has been provided if you need to rest.

The labyrinth is located just below Lions Park in Proston.

Run out of bread? Make Beer Bread (also called 1 2 3 Bread) 1 can of beer 3 tablespoons sugar

Mix well. Put in greased pan. Bake at 180 deg C for 30-45 minutes.

- \*\*You can substitute lemon lime soda or seltzer water for the beer.
- \*\*\*You can spruce it up a bit as well. Brush the top with garlic. Mix in cheese and/or bacon bits. Add herbs.

Alternative Recipe - Drink the beer and forget about the bread!







Cloud Dough

It's like play dough, but softer! Smells amazing and it feels like soft clouds in your hands

750g of cornflour

500ml cheap scented conditioner

Mix together! That's it.

Raspberry/Lime and Coconut/Apple

\*yes you can add essential oils

- \*\*yes you can add additional colour
- \*\*\*use with play dough stampers, cutters, and roll-

\*\*\*\*store in an airtight container

Ask children to wash their hands before playing with the dough. How long it lasts depends on how long it is out for, how often it is played with and hygiene!
