In 2023 Proston will celebrate 100 years since the coming of the rail and the subsequent development of the town. The celebrations will take place over the weekend of 30th September and 1st October 2023. In the lead-up to this important event, the Proston & District Heritage Assn are excited to announce a special day and evening of local history.

The day will commence at 9am with volunteers taking oral histories from those who would like help to put their recollections down for inclusion in a Centenary book. Sessions will run for 1½ hours each with breaks for morning tea and lunch. You will need to book for this as numbers will be limited.

From 4pm, a sausage sizzle will be available for purchase.

At 5pm, a very special event will take place. The first ever screening of movie footage taken by the late Bill Keys between 1955 and 1976 will be shown. The movie is a fascinating glimpse into the past and covers a wide range of events and everyday life in Proston. Bill's son Peter has kindly agreed to travel from Brisbane to introduce the movie, which runs for an hour and 10 minutes. Admission to the movie is \$10 for adults and \$20 for families with children, with proceeds going to the Heritage Assn. 
Due to wet weather, the Proston Golden Spurs Campdraft which was set down for 19-21 March had to be postponed and will now run 16-18 April.

Those were the days



WE REMEMBER HIM

In February 1940, 32 members of the Proston Light Horse Troop left Proston by train to attend a 3 month camp at Beaudesert. In May 1940, 31 of the Troop returned home to Proston. We remember Trooper Charles Smith who did not return home.

From a report in the South Burnett Times dated 15th May 1940 - The death occurred in Beaudesert hospital on Saturday (11/5/1940) of Charles Smith, second son of Mrs LA Smith of Brigooda and the late Andrew Smith. The deceased was a member of the Proston Light Horse Troop, but, owing to having contracted measles, was unable to return to Proston with the other member of the Troop. He was left at Beaudesert Hospital and complications developed, causing death.

The late Mr Smith was a popular member of Proston Light Horse Troop and was well liked by the residents of the district. His remains were brought to Proston on Sunday, and the funeral took place on Monday, from the Church of England, the Reverend AS Dence officiating. Mr J Krebs had charge of the arrangements. The funeral was the largest ever held in Proston and was attended by members of Proston and Wondai Light Horse Troops. The former acted as pall bearers and formed a guard of honour at the Church and at the cemetery. At conclusion of the service Mr G Panitz (Wondai) played the "Last Post". Among the many floral tributes were wreaths from Wondai Light Horse Troop, Proston Light Horse Troop, Proston Sub Branch RSSAILA, 5th Light Horse and Proston Cricket Club. *Contributed by Mrs Joyce A.
