He also inspected the plan and proposed site for an off-leash dog park in Railway Park (photo left), as well as dropping in on local businesses.

Some properties, particularly rural ones, may still be higher than last time due to the fact that we averaged the valuations over three years to minimise the impact of the new valuations.

I am excited to let you know that we have funding for a dump point that will help to attract more travellers into town. It is planned to be located directly behind the public toilets in Rodney Street. Council has also

continued to provide a large proportion of the budget for rural roads to support our agricultural industries and our outlying areas.

The dams are open again and congratulations to Doug & Kath Hughes who won the tender to continue their great work at Lake Boondooma. The Festival of the Dams is being held from Friday 14th August to Sunday 16th August at Lake Boondooma. The entries are filled but there is still an opportunity to be part of the festival with live entertainment on Friday night and draws and

Proston Lions give generously


Proston Lions Club have made donations totalling an impressive \$6917 during the last financial year.
