The following is part of a report on the Proston Apex Club which appeared in the South Burnett Times dated 18th March 1981.

Proston Apex Club has been serving the community for six years. The first meeting was convened on 26th February 1975, by the Apex clubs of Murgon and Wondai for the purpose of forming a Proston club. As a result a club was formed with office bearers being: Reg King (president), Pat Dunn (secretary) and Neal Mitchell (treasurer).

Club membership then was 28 and they were eager to start providing helpful amenities for the people of Proston and surrounding areas.

The club's first project was the clearing of the gardens in Collingwood Street. During the club's first year, spurred on by members' enthusiasm and local community support, it was decided to stage a Proston Rodeo. The first rodeo, which was held in July, was held before the club was actually chartered. Since the first rodeo, Apex has been involved each year in improving the arena and holding yards.

The club presented a \$520 movie projector to the Proston P & C Association and in 1976 the association

was also presented with an \$850 colour television.

The organisation to have benefited most from Apex is the ambulance service which has received several donations of life-saving equipment and \$2609 for its last vehicle. The pre-school and CWA rooms have also

been painted by Apexians.

Apex Park was completed in 1977 and the Murgon Blue Nurses, Proston play school and P & C receive regular donations. The major annual event of the year is the Christmas Eve Carnival which is run in conjunction with the Ambulance committee.
