Planning for Outdoor Stage

Plans for the Outdoor Performance Stage, which is to be built in Railway Park, Proston, are progressing despite the COVID-19 restrictions. The Proston & District Heritage Association are the grateful recipients of a grant of \$54,688 from the Foundation for Rural & Regional Renewal (FRRR). FRRR's Tackling Tough Times Together grant helps communities access resources needed to support one another through the effects of ongoing drought.

An outdoor stage, which will be available for use by all community groups, will be a permanent structure in the park and will be built by local builders AKR Builders of Mondure using local hardwood supplied by Ransen Timber, Proston. The proposed design is in keeping with the heritage precinct where it will be located.

On completion of the stage a special event will be held to launch the project. It is envisaged that the stage will become a focal point for residents to gather and share community events for many years to come.

Library News

Proston Library and Council office was re-opened to the public on Tuesday 26th May after an 8 week closure. A number of safety issues have been addressed within the

library building and library visitors are restricted to five people at any one time. All returned books are to be placed in the returns tub placed to the left of the front door entrance and these are quarantined for 24 hours before being wiped with antiseptic wipes and then re-shelved. A maximum of 20 books per person may be borrowed for a period of 4 weeks. We now have a permanent hand sanitizer station at the



front door, perspex screens have been placed around the front desk to allow for safe distancing and public computer usage is limited to one half hour session per person per day. No groups are allowed to meet in the library, therefore Rhyme Time sessions and

Conversations remain on hold. All halls and Council centres remain closed for public use until further advice from the Queensland Government.

EASY AS APPLE PIE

1½ cups SR Flour 3/4 cup sugar 1 egg 125g butter, melted 1 teasp vanilla 1 large tin pie apples

Mix flour and sugar. Add melted butter, beaten egg and vanilla. Mix all together with a fork. Press 3/4 of the mixture over the base and sides of a large greased pie plate. Add apple. Sprinkle remaining mixture over the apple. Sprinkle with brown sugar and cinnamon. Bake at 180°C for 55 mins.
