

Success for Hivesville family

"Anderlea", a family owned piggery at Hivesville, has taken out top honours in the Kingaroy Show Pork Carcass Competition for the porker class. Anderlea Pork which is owned and operated by Peter & Tracy Anderson along with Peter & Margaret Anderson took out first prize in the Porker class. A total of 46 carcasses, comprising 24 bacon and 22 pork carcasses from 9 piggeries made up the 2017 Competition.

"Competition was very close in both classes and the carcasses were of the highest standard," Tracy explained. "We were thrilled to attend the inaugural dinner and presentation evening and be awarded a first place."

Currently there are 10 people employed on the farm including family

members, full and part time workers and contractors. "It's a busy place around here," Tracy said.

Three years ago Peter and Tracy made the decision to expand the piggery to 500 sows which included building 4 new weaner and grower sheds. This project is about half way through and should be completed by the end of 2017.

During the expansion phase,

the Andersons have taken full advantage of new technology and installed fully electronic feeding systems for their sows and growers. Their piggery is now sow stall free and sows are group-housed and trained to walk into feeding stations. They are also excited about installing a new feeding system for their grower pigs. "It's Danish technology and it's pretty amazing" Tracy commented.

Congratulations to this hardworking family for the success they have achieved.
