Key to her success has been her involvement in the Proston State School Rural Studies program under the guidance of teacher Katrina Hayward. Below is a brief outline of the topics covered at the Round Table Meeting held on Thursday 23 August.

- * A report was given on the recent walk and plans for future work in **Reinke Scrub**Conservation Park.
- * Another 12 brands were added to the seating at the fire pit in the **Overnight Camp area.**
- * Kathy Crane advised that work would commence soon on the **Labyrinth.**
- * Robyn Grivell gave an update on the progress of the Re-invent Proston initiative.
- * Men's Shed advised that proceeds of their Car Boot Sale & Auction would go to Farm Aid via the Lions Club.

- * Lions Club advised that the Christmas Carnival has been set for Saturday 15 December in Railway Park, Proston. They also reminded all of the Healthy Living Forum on September 15.
- * Craig Stephens gave a report on progress at the Proston Golf Club. \$21,500 grant to upgrade the kitchen. Grey nomads are making good use of the facilities at their free camp and a new caretaker has been appointed. Mapleton Men's Shed will visit from 23-29 September to volunteer their time assisting with exterior painting of the clubhouse and helping to remove the cold room. In conjunction with the Campdraft Assn a track will be made from the Golf Club across the gully to

town to encourage campers to access the town's business area. The volunteers will also assist with making a disabled track in Reinke Scrub. The Club reported some issues around their lease with Council and asked for the support of Round Table.

- * David Hunter advised that the Local Ambulance Committee is looking for new members.
- * Hec Dionysius reported that the Proston Bowls Club is having difficulty continuing and will hold a Special General Meeting on Wed 5 Sept at 7pm to decide on their future direction.
