# An "Uplifting" Story

Proston and district locals can always be relied upon to support any cause that will improve the services available to their community. When it became apparent that our local paramedics needed assistance when lifting patients after a fall, the call went out to raise \$5500 to buy a Raizer Lift Chair. The battery-operated mobile device can lift a person weighing up to 150kg into a seated position and they can then be easily moved into an Ambulance.

Proston LAC president Mr Dave Hunter said he expected it to take 12 months to raise the necessary funds, but amazingly the money was raised in just two months. A function was held in Blake Street recently to hand over the special piece of equipment. Proston Ambulance Officer Kim Urguhart was on hand to accept the donation and demonstrate the lift chair with LAC member Raymond Dionysius acting as the patient.

All fundraisers were thanked and presented with Certificates of Appreciation. Smaller donations of up to \$200 were acknowledged and appreciated just as much in helping to reach the target. The former Hivesville Market Committee also donated \$1000 from their funds following the closure of the markets. President Dave Hunter said this would be used for future projects.

#### **Roads in our Region**

There has been an enormous amount of flood damage to the roads across our region. The serious safety concerns are dealt with under what is called emergent works as approved by the Queensland Reconstruction Authority. The damage on every individual road is then put forward by Council to be assessed as to whether it is actual flood damage. Council must provide before and after evidence to justify their claim. Once approved Council can then repair the road damage or seek external contractors depending on the workload. The whole process can take quite some time so if you have flood damage to your road it may take longer than usual to have it repaired.




